The course *European political and administrative institutions* aims to introduce and familiarize students with the main approaches, concepts, and theories that explain how the European institutional system was established, both regarding the start of institutional construction within the European Communities and the institutional reform and creation of the institutional framework of the European Union.

The course *European political and administrative institutions* contributes to shaping an intellectual experience of specialists connected to and anchored in the labor market and contemporary society.

Given students' specific learning needs, the teaching process will be based on the use of expository teaching methods (lecture, presentation) as well as conversational-interactive ones, based on discovery learning models (through documentation, text analysis, case study, critical approach). Teaching will use lectures based on PowerPoint presentations or audio-video materials made available to students. Each class will begin with a recap of the concepts and theories covered, with emphasis on recent acquisitions.



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The course *European political and administrative institutions* offers both a theoretical and a practical vision to support students in their learning efforts and in developing optimal relationships of collaboration and effective communication in a climate favorable to discovery learning. Practicing effective communication skills is envisaged to regulate behavior in diverse cultural, social, and professional contexts and to adapt the pedagogical approach to students' learning needs.

The ability to work efficiently in a team will be practiced by taking on topics and designing papers and presentations.
